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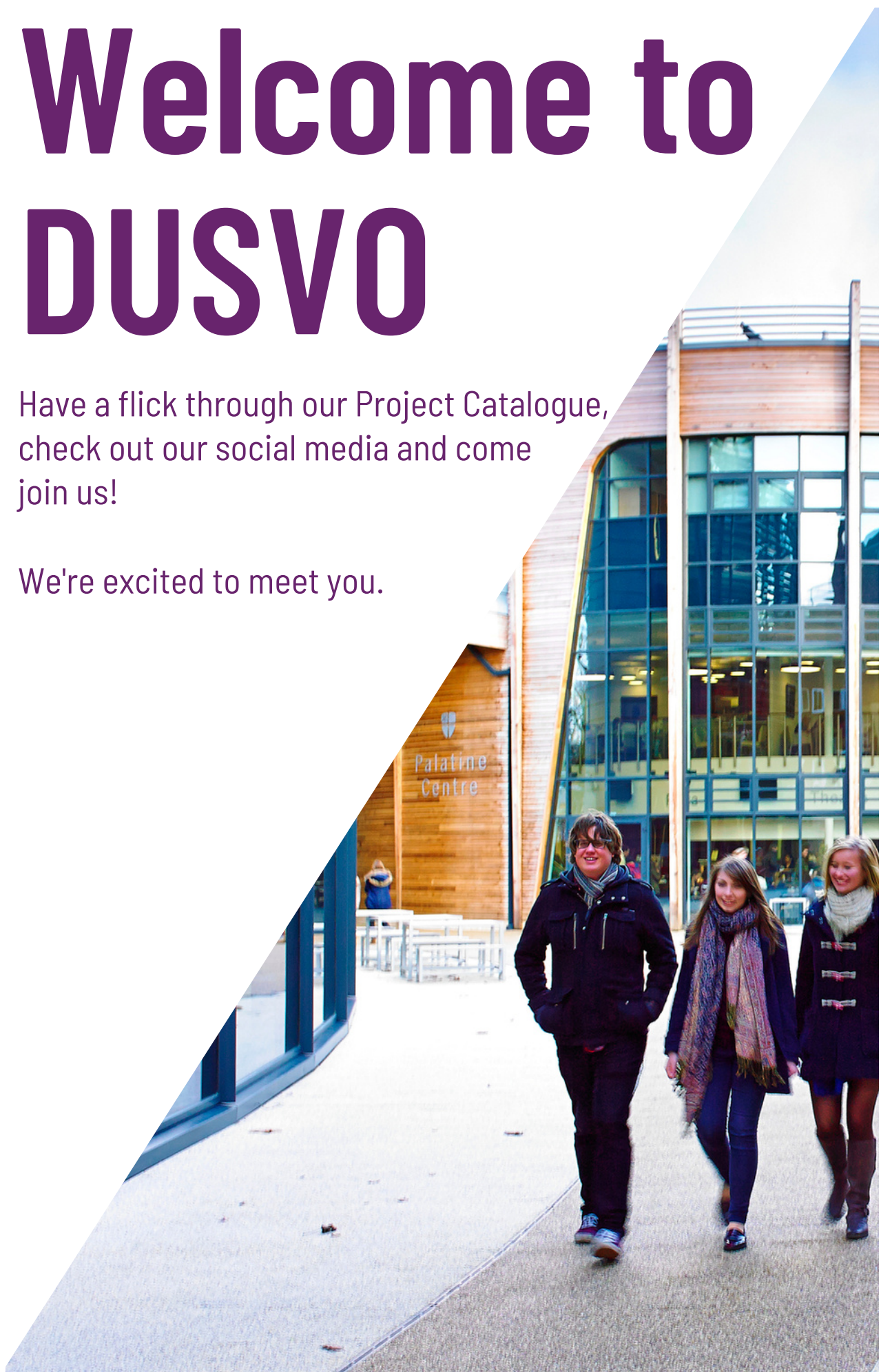

AN INTRODUCTION TO DUSVO

Welcome (or welcome back) to Durham! The Durham experience provides you with many opportunities to try something new, step out of your comfort zone, pursue your passions, meet new people, develop your skillset or just have fun – and volunteering is no exception.

Durham University Student Volunteering and Outreach (DUSVO) is the home of student-led, community-focused volunteering at Durham University.

Established in 1989, we aim to support the local community, and offer a unique volunteering experience to all Durham students. It's easy to get involved, whether participating in a project as a volunteer, taking on more responsibility as a Project Leader or standing for election to the Exec. We have over 50 projects to choose from as well as a range of one off opportunities and fundraising events. Our projects have developed based upon the need and requests of the community and the passions and interests of our students.

Overseen by a student executive committee working alongside permanent staff and based in the Palatine Centre, DUSVO has long been at the centre of the Durham student experience.

We are also recognised by Investing in Volunteers (IiV) – the UK quality standard for good practice in volunteer management, as well as the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service.

We always round off each year of successful volunteering with our annual Durham University Volunteer Awards, free for all volunteers to attend, to recognise the positive impact you have made on the local community. The Durham University Student Volunteers Certification Scheme also recognises the invaluable contribution our students make to the local community through volunteering. The certification scheme recognises 3 different levels of volunteering, based on the total number of accumulated hours a student has volunteered during their time at Durham University: Bronze, Silver, Gold and Hall of Fame.

Being a part of DUSVO can be as much of your Durham experience as you want it to be – whether volunteering is your thing, or just something you'd like to dip into every now and again.

DUSVO PROJECTS

DUSVO oversees more than 50 student led volunteering projects and has been the leading student volunteering organisation since 1989. Our projects are divided into four project streams:



Educational



Social Inclusion



Environmental



Cultural

Within these, there are projects to suit all interests and personal needs: from dog-walking, to helping older people, to tutoring local school children.

EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS

1-1 Tutoring

1-2-1 tutoring is a volunteering project which pairs university students with a local GCSE/ A level student to tutor for one hour a week in a subject of their choice. The project hopes to increase student's grade attainments, boost confidence and improve educational development.

Beyond Boundaries

This project visits Fowl Green Farm to socialise and interact with people with mental disabilities and learning difficulties, with the aim of improving their confidence, social skills, and reducing the workload of the amazing staff at the centre.

CATSS works with Primary and Secondary age children from hard to reach backgrounds in the North East to provide them with new opportunities and chances to make friends through the running of daytrips and residentials.

This project is one of our biggest DUSVO projects, so operates a little differently in its running and recruitment of volunteers.

To volunteer with this project, you need to apply via an application form that will be shared with interested freshers, and also shared on CATSS's social media in the first few weeks of first term. Applicants will then undergo an interview with the Project leaders before being selected for the primary or secondary project

Once selected, this project does not often take on volunteers throughout the year.

Team Durham are part of a partnership group with 6 other UK universities (Edinburgh, Stirling, Cardiff, Loughborough, Northumbria, St Andrews) delivering Volunteer Zambia.

Every year, a number of Durham University students fundraise and travel to Zambia for six weeks over the summer to deliver sport and performing arts activities in Livingston and Lusaka.

To do this we work with Zambian government, sports federations, charity organisations and most importantly Zambian volunteer coaches.

We are guided by our Zambian colleagues on how we can support and help them to grow. It is a mutually beneficial relationship as the experience our students gain from their involvement is often life changing.

Students and young Zambians work side-by-side, creating opportunities to develop new and existing skills, exchange knowledge and undertake new experiences beyond those that university alone can provide.
